Looking forward to the Arts Festival this Sunday! Check out a few snapshots of all the prep going on.





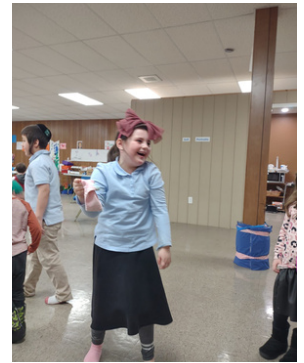
Pre-K/K Learning

Parsha Questions

1. What was the first Mitzvah that Moshe taught Bnei Yisroel in this week's Parsha?
2. When the heads of each shevet waited to donate towards the Mishkan, what ended up happening?
3. Who did HaShem choose to build the Mishkan and Keilim? Why?
4. There were many miracles that happened with the Aron, what are some examples of miracles?
5. What happened when Bnei Yisroel tried to put the Mishkan together?
6. What holiday comes out on the same day the Mishkan was completed?
7. How did the people know that Hashem's presence was in the Mishkan?
8. How can we bring Hashem's presence into our world today?
9. What will be said at the end of this week's parsha reading?
10. Which book of the Torah is now complete?



Parsha Answers

1. Shabbos!
2. Within two days of Moshe announcing that Bnei Yisroel should donate whatever they could, everything was donated and there was nothing left. The heads had nothing to bring for the Mishkan so they decided to donate the precious stones needed for the Kohen Gadols clothing.
3. Betzalel ben Uri the grandson of Chur, great grandson of Miriam. Chur gave up his life trying to keep Bnei Yisroel from doing the Cheit HaEgel, now his grandson is the one building the Mishkan so that the Jews could serve HaShem properly.
4. When Bnei Yisroel traveled from place to place, it would travel in the front. A fire would come from between the Kruvim and burn up all the snakes and scorpions. Any enemies of Bnei Yisroel would also be burnt up. The fire also burned up all thorns so Bnei Yisroel could travel through the desert with ease. The aron also carried itself.
5. Neither Bnei Yisroel or Betzalel were able to figure out how to make the pieces fit for the Mishkan. Moshe saw how hard everyone worked and felt bad that it was not coming together. In actuality, HaShem wanted Moshe to be the one to put it together since he didnt get to have anything special .
